Summary of Job Role:

Derbyshire Cricket are delighted to be able to offer an excellent opportunity for a Performance Nutritionist to join the Club's Science and Medicine team on a part-time basis for the 2024 season.

Reporting to the Lead Strength & Conditioning (S&C), this role will require the successful candidate to deliver first-class nutritional support to our professional playing squad and to help create robust and repeatable systems, for nutritional monitoring, in conjunction with the multi-disciplinary team.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

- Devise and lead the Derbyshire Cricket performance nutrition strategy, endorsing best practice with the professional playing squad.
- Adapting the nutritional support to best assist players depending on their role and environment both in pre-season and during competition.
- Provide evidence-based intervention for injured and rehabilitating athletes in close coordination with Lead Strength and Conditioning Coach and Physiotherapists.
- Inform the supplement provision at the club demonstrating quality assurance of supplement products, with a detailed understanding of anti-doping.

- Collate records of all nutrition and supplement interventions in the form of batch codes, in close coordination with the Lead Strength and Conditioning Coach.
- Contribute to multi-disciplinary meetings, either in person or digitally, to enhance the holistic approach of the department towards performance and rehabilitation.
- Communicate with the Club's Events Team to devise menus that are game and format specific and regulated to enhance team performance.
- Provide and/or present reports on delivery or an individual player at the request of the Head Coach or Lead Strength and Conditioning Coach.

- Degree in Nutrition, Sports Nutrition, Sport and Exercise Nutrition or related subject.
- A postgraduate degree in Sport Nutrition or in a relevant discipline.
- SENR accreditation at minimum graduate registration level.

- Full UK Driving License.
- Experience of working within professional sport.
- Ability to deliver in a creative way which not only engages athletes but presents material in a way that is relevant and in context to cricket.
