We are committed to making cricket accessible and removing cost barriers to playing cricket. In 2024, in partnership with the ECB, we provided **886 children** with funded National Programme places.



ENGAGE CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

We provided high quality Falcons coaching camps for children aged 5-13 all year round throughout the school holidays, giving children the chance to develop their skills in a fun and enjoyable environment!

CRICKET IN THE PLAYGROUND....

In partnership with Chance to Shine, we continue to grow cricket in state primary schools, engaging more children year on year to choose cricket!

In 2024 through our Chance to Shine Schools programme, we delivered:



124 Primary Schools Engaged - 27% Increase

400+ Teachers Trained - 60% Increase

35%+ National Programme participants transitioned from a Chance to Shine School

We created a place-based approach to all of our Chance to Shine delivery in 2024, aligned to National Programmes and other community opportunities within the County.

We delivered to schools in the most disadvantaged areas - 42 schools with over 40% of their children in receipt of free school meals.

The sessions really engaged our children who have additional needs and those that don't engage with sport, the children now play cricket during lunch breaks"



REMOVING BARRIERS TO ACCESS AND IMPROVING OPPORTUNITY!

At the DCF we are committed to our mission to make cricket a game for everyone. We recognise that cost can be a barrier to accessing cricket and we are determined to remove that barrier to ensure as many people as possible can connect with the game!

During 2024 we awarded Access to Cricket Grants for those in need of financial support to help fund activity and purchase equipment.

We launched our 'Kit Out Derbyshire' kit recycling scheme during 2024

The Kit recycling scheme takes cricket equipment and clothing donations and then recycles them to people in need of new kit.

During 2024 we provided financial support to under-represented groups and to those experiencing financial hardship to help increase the diversity of our coaching workforce.



POSITIVE SPIN.....

We launched our 'Positive Spin' Walking Cricket programme in partnership with MacMillan Cancer Support, aimed at those affected by cancer, providing weekly cricket sessions.

We secured funding to deliver a cricket programme for Asylum Seekers based in Derby City. Our Asylum project is having a positive impact on the lives of those who attend.
